Why is it difficult to end a relationship? How should this be done?

What are the signs of a healthy relationship? What are the signs of an unhealthy relationship?


Ending a relationship is one of the most difficult things we have to do. No matter where you are in the breakup process, knowing how to break up well (including how to break up with someone you love) can help make this transition smoother and less harmful for both partners. Fear of hurting someone you love, their reaction to your decision, your own confused emotions, can all lead to a break up being really hard.

Democracy - a system of government by the whole population or all the eligible members of a state, typically through elected representatives.

Dictatorship - a ruler with total power over a country, typically one who has obtained control by force.

WHY IS VOTING IMPORTANT IN A DEMOCRACY?

- It gives you a say on important issues that affect you – from roads and recycling, to education and climate change.
- Voting gives you a say on who represents you in your local council, in the UK Parliament.
- People across the world have died fighting for the right to vote and be part of a democracy. In the UK, in the early 20th century, people were killed during their struggles to get the vote for women.
- Black people were not allowed to vote in South Africa until the end of apartheid in 1994. Today, many people across the world are still denied the right to vote. By voting you are showing your support for people who have had to fight hard for democracy.

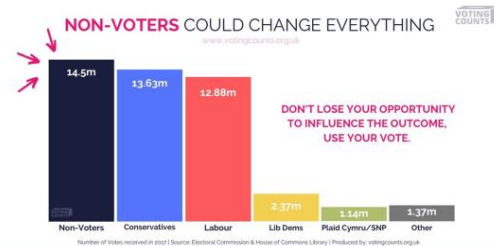

HOW CAN WE HOLD THOSE IN POWER TO ACCOUNT? WHY IS VOTING IMPORTANT IN RELATION TO THE QUESTION?

- Voting gives you the power to decide how the UK is run. The MPs you help to elect will be making decisions on issues that you care about, including NHS, Housing, Education and the Environment.
- By voting in the election you can support a candidate who will represent your views in parliament, and can influence the policy issues you care about. An election is also your chance to speak out if you have a complaint about the way the country is being run. Remember, voting is not the only way to participate but it's the quickest and easiest way!
- If you don't vote, you'll have had no say over who will be making decisions on the issues important to you.

Are protests good? What are the reasons people protest?

- People realise they are not alone in their beliefs. Protests bring people together who have the same ideas and beliefs, creating a sense of community that they may not find elsewhere.
- By protesting, the protestors can start a debate about the topic that they are protesting about. If enough people join the protest, it is hard for those in charge / the government to ignore.
- Protesting provides minority groups with a voice which can sometimes be missed.
- Sometimes protests cause immediate/short term changes in the law or people perception of an issue. This can lead to further changes.
- Sometimes protests can last for generations and take a long time to change the views of people and those in power. For example, the positive changes in attitudes made around homosexuality in Britain has taken a long time.

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
