Transition Arrangements

We understand that the transition from Primary to Secondary education can be both an exciting and a challenging process for both pupils and parents.

Our transition arrangements are carefully planned to ensure that students are ready for a successful and enjoyable Year 7. Arrangements start in Year 5 and build up to a full school visit in the summer term of Year 6. A full programme of activities are offered to all primary schools throughout Year 6.

If you have any questions regarding transition, at any stage of the process, please do not hesitate to ask. Staff are always available to answer questions at the various events or you can e-mail the school at any time.

Meden School is increasingly popular and has become the school of first choice for students from a wide range of primary schools. As well as visiting our linked primary schools, we regularly run information evenings for out-of-catchment parents. Details can be found on our school website.

We welcome visits to the school from prospective parents and students. If you would like to arrange a visit or if you have any questions, please contact the school by phone or e-mail.

We very much look forward to welcoming you and your child to Meden School.

Step One: Summer Term, Year 5

The Head of School and a member of the Leadership Team meet prospective parents at their child's current primary school. A short talk will be followed by a question and answer session.

Step Two: Autumn Term, Year 6

Pupils and parents are invited to an open evening to look around Meden School and meet members of staff in all the teaching departments.

Step Three: Spring Term, Year 6

Data will be collected from the primary feeder schools to help arrange admissions.

Step Four: Summer Term, Year 6

A member of the Pastoral Team and the Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator will visit primary schools to talk to students and staff.

Step Five: Summer Term, Year 6

Year 6 pupils will visit Meden School with their classmates for a 'Taster Week' to allow them to familiarise themselves with the school. Pupils with Special Educational Needs may well have additional visits.

Achievement

Curriculum


Our curriculum follows National Curriculum guidelines and aims to provide a broad, balanced learning experience for all.

At Key Stage 3, our two-year programme covers all the National Curriculum subjects. Students are taught in ability groups in the majority of subjects, ensuring that every child is taught at a level that matches their ability.

There is a three-year programme for Key Stage 4. All students study a core consisting of English, Mathematics, Science, Physical Education and Religious/Personal/Social/Health Education. All students must study at least one subject from; a language, History, Geography or Computer Science. This is supplemented by a wide range of optional subjects, including Visual and Performing Arts, Technology and Social Sciences.

We expect most of our students to achieve at least 8 passes at grades A*- C, including English and Mathematics. Every student is actively encouraged to work towards the new English Baccalaureate standard, invaluable for university applications.

Meden College offers a range of pathways for students to continue learning with us during Key Stage 5. We pride ourselves on our A Level provision and promote the highest aspirations for all our students. This approach has seen students from Meden College regularly secure places at top universities, including Oxford and Cambridge.



Extra Curricular

Meden School offers a comprehensive programme of extra curricular activities enabling students to extend their learning beyond the classroom. Enrichment activities are a compulsory element of the timetable.

We have access to excellent sports facilities and students enjoy activities including football, hockey, netball, rugby, cross-country, tennis and athletics. Meden students regularly compete at county level and our sports teams have a strong tradition of success.

Music is very much at the heart of Meden School and we encourage students to take up or continue playing a musical instrument. There are regular concerts and workshops where students can demonstrate their skills and an annual school production.

The Performing Arts take a leading role in school life with regular dance and drama productions, allowing all students to fully explore their creativity.

In addition we run a wide range of trips and visits, which include residential and international opportunities. In recent years, Meden students have travelled as far afield as France and Taiwan.
