

Dear Parents/Carers,

I am writing to inform you of changes that will take place to our school day from September 2021.

Over the past 12 months we have been evaluating the effectiveness of our school day in supporting the school mission of striving to provide the best education for every student, in delivering the highest quality learning in the classroom matched with a rich variety of opportunities to support each child at this stage of their learning journey. Throughout the past 18 months we have been developing our curriculum to support our students to grow into well-informed, well-balanced and confident young people and the change of the school day supports the vision of our curriculum.

The restructuring of the school day we will ensure we:

- ▶ Improve on the depth of learning during lessons and therefore improve progress and achievement.
- ▶ Provide an extensive breadth of opportunity for all learners; maintaining a broad curriculum at KS3 and extensive option choice at KS4 and KS5.
- Ensure we support all of our students to achieve the very best educational outcomes.
- ► Maintain personalisation of learning pathways and tiering: to best suit the learning needs of each student.
- ► Maintain a smooth, orderly and well supervised lunch time: to ensure all students can purchase and consume their lunch in a timely and calm manner
- ▶ Deliver a comprehensive digital home learning programme for all year groups; Home learning is fundamental to student achievement. Recent educational research highlights the positive impact on student achievement by additional progress of 5 months compared to student who don't do any home learning. All tasks will be set for students via Microsoft Teams, which students have used extensively during lockdown lessons. As through the pandemic we will support our students and families with the technology needed to access the digital home learning programme where appropriate.
- ▶ Offer a breakfast and homework club made available for all students Monday to Friday at the start and end of the day. This will be open to all year groups to support students in giving them a space and a computer to complete their home learning. Also, this facility can be used for siblings of student who are staying for study support (Y10/Y11) or the transition project learning pathway (Y7).
- ▶ Y7 Transition Project Learning Pathway: This transition project learning pathway will support the students transition from primary to secondary school. We will be delivering a wide range of activities that will enhance what we deliver in lesson time. This pathway will help them to develop an outstanding attitude to learning and aid Y7 students to settle well into secondary school life.



- ▶ Deliver study support to our KS4 examination year groups: All Y10 and Y11 students will have bespoke study support sessions that will support their achievement in their GCSE examinations and controlled assessments. These sessions will allow students to work on core knowledge and skills identified by their teachers so that they are better prepared to fulfil their potential.
- ► Extra-curricular (Tuesday and Wednesday): Students will have access to a high quality extracurricular programme that will help them to learn about themselves and develop and use their skills and knowledge in different contexts.
- ▶ Develop Staff with professional Learning: It essential that staff have the access to the highest quality training both from expertise within the school and from outstanding practice from outside the school in order to deliver our new curriculum effectively. Thursdays and Fridays allow staff to be involved in bespoke professional learning program. This program will ensure that the quality of education delivered to all students remains as our top priority. It gives us, as a school, the time to constantly evaluate teaching and learning and support students to achieve the very best.
