Dear Parent/ Carers,

I am writing out with a reminder of our school uniform expectations.

As we start to see an improvement in the weather and seasons change, we see some items of clothing being worn to school that are NOT part of our school uniform.

Meden School uniform:

- Meden School blazer,
- Meden tie,
- white shirt – short or long sleeved,
- black school trousers
- black school shoes
- an optional black V-neck jumper can be worn.

Can I stress, in particular, that the following items DO NOT form part of our school uniform and MUST NOT BE WORN:

- Hoodies (including underneath blazers),
- Sweatshirts other than the permitted V-neck black jumper,
- Leggings,
- Trainers,
- Multiple earrings,
- Nose piercings and other items of jewellery should not be worn.
- False or acrylic nails are not permitted and hair colour should be natural.
