Dear Parent/Carer,

As we approach the end of term I'd like to remind you of the school's uniform expectations so you can ensure your child is fully prepared for 6th June. Whilst it is clear our students take great pride in their appearance in school, please can you support us by ensuring your child is school ready by being in full and complete uniform.

As a polite reminder, students should be wearing the following. Illustrations of appropriate items are shown below:

- white school shirt,
- Meden blue striped tie
- Meden School blazer
- Black school trousers
- or a lack knee length skirt.
- Black leather shoes (If students are not in shoes then a school pair will be provided.)

If your child would like to wear a jumper, it must be a black v-neck jumper.

Each year group has its own lanyard and this must be worn at all times and forms part of the uniform.

Some students have told us they can't wear their school shoes because of blisters, to assist with this we now have a supply of blister plasters and these will be provided where needed.

If there are any issues with obtaining uniform, or a medical reason your child cannot wear the correct uniform please contact Miss. Hibbert in Student Services and she will offer any support we can.

Students are **only allowed one pair of stud earrings**.

Ear bars and similar piercings are **NOT** part of our uniform. Nose studs are also **NOT** part of our school uniform.

If your child has applied false nails, please can you ensure that they are removed before returning to school, so your child is school ready.



Hoodies

I would like to remind you that hoodies and round neck jumpers are **not school uniform**. If a student wears them to school, they must place them in their school bag when they arrive in school and only put them on when they leave school site. If a student is found to be wearing a hoodie, we will confiscate it until the end of the school day and taken to student services.

Finally, it is important to us that all our students are ready and prepared to learn, when they arrive to their lessons. We supply all students with the basic equipment they need to engage in our lessons, and we do this free of charge. Students are given a full set of equipment at the start of the term and can resupply as needed during tutorial. To support this please can you ensure that your child has a suitable **school bag** where they can keep all of their equipment. If for any reason you need support with getting a school bag then please let Miss. Hibbert know and we will do what we can to help you.
