Please can you register your approval/disapproval for your child to receive the appropriate vaccine. In cases where there are more than 1 vaccine you will have to complete one for each.

Dear Parent/Guardian

Your child is now due their **Meningococcal ACWY vaccination** and their **Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Polio (Teenage 3 in 1 Booster)** vaccination. These vaccines are offered to all students in Year 9. These are part of the childhood immunisation programme.

## Why get your child vaccinated?

- Meningococcal ACWY protects your son/daughter against four types of meningococcal bacteria (Types A, C, W and Y) that cause meningitis (inflammation of the brain lining) and septicaemia (blood poisoning). We strongly urge you to take this opportunity to protect your son/daughter against these four infections which, as you will be aware, can kill or have serious life-long consequences.
- The 3 in 1 booster protects your son/daughter against Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Polio, all of which can be very serious diseases. This is a booster for the vaccinations your son/daughter received as a baby, and then again at approximately 3-4 years (the preschool booster).

# Your Child's Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccination is now due!

This vaccine is part of the Childhood Immunisation Programme and consists of 2 doses given in school between 6 and 24 months apart.

- Having the HPV vaccine helps protect both boys and girls from Human Papillomavirus related cancers.
- The UK programme has already contributed to preventing future deaths from cancer. We expect it
  to eventually prevent hundreds of cancer deaths every year.
