Year 7 ATL Report

Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a pleasure to welcome the new Year 7 cohort to Meden. We have been impressed with their willingness to learn and their determination to be the very best that they can be. At Meden, we use, 'Attitude to Learning' (ATL) scores, to let you know about your child's attitude, effort, and character in lessons. Statistics show that students, who have a good or outstanding ATL score, achieve much better during their time in school. On the back of this letter, you will see the characteristics that students need to show, in order to achieve a good or outstanding ATL score. Your child's first set of 'Attitude to Learning' (ATL) scores can be viewed on, 'My Child at School' (MCAS). ATL descriptors can also be found here under important documents.

We expect all students to achieve an average ATL score that is 1.9 or better (1 is the top score that a child can achieve, with 4 being the lowest score). To achieve a score of 1.9 or better, students need to achieve a score of 2 in most of their subjects, alongside a score of 1 in at least one subject.

If a student has received a score of 3 or 4, in any of their subjects, this means that they have not demonstrated to their teacher, that they are trying their best. It could be, for example, that when they find something difficult, instead of showing perseverance and determination to keep trying, they quickly give up. Other examples of an ATL that needs to improve could be rushed homework that includes careless errors, or a lack of focus in lessons.

During each year, you will receive a set of ATL scores for your child at the end of every half term. You will also receive information about how your child is progressing in their subjects; this will be available for you to view on, 'My Child at School', at the end of each full term.
