The concert is available for you to view from the front page of our website. Relax and enjoy!



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
This half term has seem many of our Y13 students completing their application forms on UCAS to be able to go to university. Some have already re-

ceived offers and it is a really exciting time for them all.


As they all prepare for mock exams in January it has been a really busy time but that hasn't stopped them contributing to the wider community.

All contributions made up the final total raised by the school which was over £1000, so THANK YOU for your support!








Save the Date

Year 10: 12.15-1.00pm


Year 11,12 & 13: 1.15-2.15pm
