Absence from College

Now a student is in College, we aim to provide them with the skills to take responsibility for their own learning. Due to this we encourage students to take the lead with informing staff when they are absent.

School should be informed of all instances of / requests for absence.

If the absence is unplanned then the students must notify the college by email to collegeattendance@medenschool.co.uk prior to 7.30am in the morning or at the earliest possible convenience.

If a student is aware they will absent in advance, they should complete a **yellow leave of absence form**. This should be signed by any teachers of any lessons that would be missed that day plus the Head of College. It is an **expectation that the student requests and catches up on any work missed prior to returning to college.**

Attendance will be monitored by the students mentor and the Head of College, and concerns will be raised with parents where attendance has dipped below 94%.

Please note that any holidays will not be authorised during the school term.

Uniform

There is no set uniform at KS5 but clothing must be appropriate for a learning environment. If dressed inappropriately, students will be asked to return home and change in to more appropriate attire.

The objectives of the causal but appropriate dress code are to help:

- Promote self-esteem amongst our students
- Prepare students for the world of work
- Provide our wider community with a positive image of our school

Members of Meden College will be expected to set a decent and high standard in their personal appearance. College students will be seen by the rest of the school and will therefore be expected to act as role models and set an example for all other students in their personal appearance.

Items not considered appropriate for a learning environment-

- Crop tops
- Low cut or revealing tops
- Shorts above mid thigh
- Skirts above mid thigh
- Open toed sandals (due to health and safety when in science labs)

The judgement of the Head of College will be final on the matters of acceptable dress and presentation.

Hair colouring and piercings are allowed.

Standard equipment

Pastoral Systems

Tutorial (Mentor time)

Students will see their mentor during tutorial every morning. That is an opportunity for check-ins and mentoring to take place.

The mentor should be a student or parent's first port of call. Where appropriate, any concerns will be escalated to the Head of College.

Rewards and Sanctions

Rewards

Green slips are awarded for instances of:

- · Extended reading completed
- Showing resilience when given feedback or completing tasks
- Students setting high standards for themselves
- Focused within lesson and starting tasks immediately
- Reflecting on work and improving even when not directly asked
- · Making thoughtful and considered contributions
- Using specialist terminology in answers
- Completing high quality homework and Uplearn
- Consistently revising in subjects
- Achieving target grade in work
- Showing resilience and determination to improve work

The top green slip achievers in each subject will be rewarded with a trip at the end of each term

Sanctions

The ethos of the school is to encourage our college students to be mature adults and take responsibility for their own actions. If there are concerns about a students level of effort, their work or their behaviour, they will have conversations with their mentor in the first instance.

If the concerns continue, then there will be communication with parents about the concerns. If this persists, there will be a meeting with student and parents where the next steps are discussed.

Life in Meden College

College students are treated as young adults; they are expected to show leadership to the younger students and act with greater maturity and responsibility and consequently enjoy increased privileges.

Independent study

College students have independent study periods built into their timetable. Effective use should be made of this time and students should be working in the hub quietly.

If a member of staff is absent, work will be set by the teacher and students are expected to work without formal supervision. Students should check their emails and/or Microsoft Teams for cover work. In all cases of teacher absence, students should remain in the usual teaching room and complete all set work.

Leaving school grounds

All students must be in school, on time, for morning registration.

Student may leave school during their break and lunch but must return for the afternoon unless they have allocated block time, in which case they may leave school after their final lesson. Any absence from lesson which has not been previously agreed will appear on any reports.

Usual procedures for permission apply should students wish to leave school during lesson time ie a yellow leave of absence form needs to be completed and signed by all the relevant teachers. This should then be taken to the attendance office a week prior to the planned absence.

All students leaving school must sign out at the student iPad located in the main SLT corridor near reception. All students must sign back in on their return.

Lunch

College students are able to eat lunch in any area of the College, or the canteen. There is a kettle, fridge and microwave available in the college kitchen for their use throughout the day. Students may make cold or not drinks and take them in the study hub area during independent learning. There are also vending machines in the hub which offer contactless payments.

College study hub

The study hub should be kept tidy at all times. This is a courtesy to those who use it and it is also important as visitors will often be shown into this room. Lockers should be used to avoid mess and loss of personal items. These are available from Mrs Coulson for a £10 deposit (payable through the SQUID account). Mobile phones are not to be used during lesson or independent study time. They can, however, be used during break and lunch.

School policies and protocols

Catch-up

Students who need to repeat poor work, complete missing work or who have missed a test through absence, will be asked to catch up in their own time. This should be a priority for students prior to returning to their next lesson. It is the students responsibility to proactively request the missed work from teachers.

Chewing gum

Gum is not permitted anywhere on the school site or on school trips.

Drugs

The use or possession of sedatives, stimulants, tranquillizers, hallucinogens, psychotropics or solvents is not allowed. The school reserves the right to search a student or their belongings when there are suspicions that any inappropriate substance has been used. Parents and/or the police will be involved as appropriate.

Fire

Any student discovering a fire should sound the alarm by breaking the contact on the nearest fire alarm call point. On hearing the fire bell, students should leave the building in silence and in an orderly manner, via the nearest safe available exit. They should line up as directed on the yard for registration, and must not re-enter the building until instructed it is safe to do so. Students must not use/tamper with fire extinguishers. Regular fire drills are carried out, to ensure that students are familiar with procedures.

First Aid

If taken ill or injured at school, students should ask to be excused from the lesson and go to Student Services. The first aider will decide whether the student needs to receive medical support or go home. If a student is in college but are too ill to go to lessons, they must go to the first aiders and be assessed. College staff are not able to send students home without them being seen by First Aid. A college student may be allowed home unaccompanied if the first aider is satisfied that they are well enough to make their own way home.

School policies and protocols

ICT

Appropriate use

Onadmission, students are required to read and signacopy of the school's technology usage agreement. A copy of this is also sent to parents. A copy of the code of practice is available to view online. Students should not use their school email accounts, access the internet via the school network or use any school software (inc. MS Teams) for any reason other than education.

Hardware

The students will predominantly be using their allocated Chromebooks or college PCs for their work in school. Students are not expected to bring their own laptop into school unless you feel this is beneficial for their learning and students are able to take responsibility for their own devices. They will not be covered by the schools insurance and are in school at the owner's risk. They will be able to connect to the school WIFI whilst on the premises.

Printers, printing and photocopying

Every student has a printer credit account and are able to use this at any time. There is a printer in the college study hub where students can print colour or black and white copies of their work. Printing can also be sent directly to photocopiers.

Lockers

Every student has the opportunity to get a secure locker. This will be located in the study hub and will be on a first come, first served basis. There is a £10 deposit paid via SQUID and Mrs Coulson will issue the keys. The deposit is returned once the key has been handed back and is paid via a SQUID refund. Deposits are not returned if keys are lost.

Medical appointments

Students are required to remain on the school premises from 8.45am until the end of the school day. Any medical appointments should be made outside of these times where possible to avoid disruption to a students learning. Students must sign out at the student iPad and sign back in on their return.

Uplearn

Uplearn is used exclusively by any student taking Science, Mathematics or Psychology.

Meden College has purchased Uplearn for the above subjects. It is hoped when they develop their provision to other subjects, we will be able to provide it for those too.
