Work/skills/activities being covered in lesson leading to exams	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Week 1 Familiar Fieldwork revision (WT mock). Use what we did on our Castleton fieldtrip to practice how to answer questions • Week 2 Unfamiliar Fieldwork revision (WT mock). Use practice questions from previous exams on unfamiliar fieldwork. Students get questions in the exam about interpreting data (maths skills such as mean, median, mode). • Week 3 Paper 2 revision. Urban issues and challenges. Looking at Rio, Curitiba, London Docklands and completing practice questions in lesson such as 9 and 6 mark questions and how to structure these answers. • Week 4 Paper 2 revision. The challenge of resource management. Looking at food, water and energy (basic knowledge) then detailed revision into energy as this is our optional choice that we focus on for this topic. Students will revise energy insecurity, fracking (a fossil fuel extraction), how to use energy sustainably in an LIC (the Micro hydro dam in Nepal). • Week 5 Pre-release. 12 weeks before the exam students get the pre-release which is a booklet including information that the students read before they go into the exam. Students will be asked questions in the exam about the information in the booklet so it is important that time is spent reading and understanding this before the exam. • Week 6 Pre-release- Students will practice potential questions based on the information booklet as practice for the pre-release questions.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Week 7 Paper 1 revision. Students will look at rivers and coasts this week. Including hard/soft engineering, deposition and erosional landforms. Case studies such as Holderness coast, Banbury flood alleviation. • Week 8 Paper 1 revision. Living world. Practice questions and retrieval tasks around biomes (hot deserts and rainforests), Amazon rainforest management, Thar desert opportunities and challenges. • Week 9 Paper 1 revision. Natural hazards - Practice questions and retrieval tasks. Content the students will look at is case studies of Haiti & New Zealand (earthquake), Typhoon Haiyan, UK extreme weather and global atmospheric circulation. • Week 10 Paper 1 (14/5/25 am) then paper 2 revision. Paper 2 revision will focus on the last topic the students finished in February 2025 which was Economic World. Students will complete wipe board retrieval tasks and practice questions. Students will focus on measures of development, how to reduce the development gap (tourism in Jamaica, Aid in Brazil, TNCs in Brazil), the types of employment in the UK (science and business parks), strategies to reduce the North-South divide and rural depopulation in the UK.
