Homework is given as part of a 3 week cycle

1. Week 1 – create flashcards
2. Week 2 – look, say, cover, write check (using the flashcards created in week 1)
3. Week 3 – Brain dump - a check to see how much you have learned

On week 1 of every cycle, you will be emailed the work to learn which are usually key words for that subject. We will also upload them to the website (Homework) and to MCAS under Important Documents. The point of the homework is to teach students how to revise effectively and to build up key vocabulary for each of their core subjects.

Here is the work per subject for this 3 week cycle

ENGLISH – Learn the following key words

Poetry	Sonnet	A 14-line poem with a variable rhyme scheme, usually abab, cdcd, efef, gg
	Quatrain	A four-line stanza in a poem
	Volta	The turning point in a poem, usually where something is revealed or the mood or atmosphere changes

SCIENCE – Learn the following key words

Physics	State of matter	The form which a substance can take, e.g. solid, liquid or gas.
	Density	How many particles are present per unit volume.
	Pressure	The force per unit area exerted on a surface.

MATHS – Learn the following key words

Area	Area of a triangle (non-right angled, given the height)	Area = (base x perpendicular height) ÷ 2 Perpendicular – at right angles https://youtu.be/6WsQH1cAYMM
	Area of a parallelogram	Area = base x perpendicular height https://youtu.be/qz0EGYO4YI0
	Parallel Perpendicular	Parallel lines – are always the same distance apart Perpendicular lines – meet at right angles

GEOGRAPHY – Learn the following key words

Africa	Densely populated	An area that has a high number of people living per unit of area.
	Conflict	A serious disagreement or argument, which can occur between individuals, groups, or countries.
	Corruption	Dishonest or fraudulent conduct by those in power, typically involving bribery.

HISTORY – Learn the following key words

Medieval Life	Continuity	Things staying the same.
	Heraldry	Heraldry is the study and design of coats of arms and other symbols that represent families, groups, or people.
	Chivalry	Chivalry is a code of good behavior that knights in the past were expected to follow. It means being brave, kind, and fair, especially to those who need help.
